Sub:- Renewal of permission for admission of 2<sup>nd</sup> batch (100 seats) of Govt. Medical College, Badaun, Uttar Pradesh under Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Rohilkhand University, Bareilly, Uttar Pradesh u/s 28 read with Section 61(2) of NMC Act, 2019 for the academic year 2020-21.

Sir/Madam,

This is in continuation to letter No.MCI-34(41)(R-30)/2019-Med./122387, dated 21.09.2020 for renewal of permission for admission of 2<sup>nd</sup> batch of 100 MBBS students at Govt. Medical College, Badaun, Uttar Pradesh under Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Rohilkhand University, Bareilly, Uttar Pradesh submitted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 to now dissolved Board of Governors in Supersession of the Medical Council of India. It is brought to your notice that the Central Government has on 24th September 2020 notified fully the NMC Act, 2019. Section 61(2) of the NMC Act, 2019 provides as under:


*"Notwithstanding the repeal of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956, the educational standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 and the rules and regulations made thereunder shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made thereunder:"*

2. Accordingly your application was processed u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 and Establishment of New Medical Colleges Regulations, 1999. I am directed to convey the permission of the Medical Assessment and Rating Board of the National Medical Commission for renewal of permission for admission of 2<sup>nd</sup> batch of 100 (one hundred only) MBBS students of Govt. Medical College, Badaun, Uttar Pradesh u/s 28 read with section 61(2) of NMC Act, 2019 for the academic year 2020-21. This is subject to:-

- (i) Submission of undertaking from the State Govt. towards rectification of deficiencies.
- (ii) Establishment of BSL-2 Lab facilities for testing of COVID-19 patients as early as possible to the MARB of National Medical Commission.

3. The Government Medical Colleges (except those located in Union Territory of J & K) shall contribute 15% of MBBS seats for which the renewal of permission is granted for All India Quota.
4. The next batch of students in the MBBS course shall be admitted only after permission of the Medical Assessment and Rating Board of the National Medical Commission for renewal as per regulations that would be framed under section 26 and 28 of the NMC Act, 2019.
5. Admissions made in violation of the above condition will be treated as irregular and action will be initiated under NMC Act and regulations made there under.
6. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of the Medical Assessment & Rating Board and the State Government.
